
Harrow Open Day



Forging a Career Path

A deeper look at common career advice. *By Lynn Yen*



Congrats! You landed a job, now what? Navigating a career can seem daunting. In the modern age, our relationship with work is free-form, and all the responsibility is on you. How do you find your way?

Ask anyone for career advice and they will likely have a nugget about a lesson they learned the hard way. These pithy lines stick in your head. They are cautionary tales, well-tested best practices, and sometimes just a line everyone says because it sounds like something we should be doing.

Like with all advice, discern for yourself. Take the advice that works for you and leave the advice that doesn't fit. With that said, there is a reason some of the same advice gets repeated and retold. Here are some common career aphorisms you've likely heard before and the lessons behind them.

“Live to Work, or Work to Live”

Do you want a job that you don't particularly like but pays for a lifestyle that makes you happy? Or do you want a job you love and that you put a lot of time into? Some jobs in the economy just need to be done. Maybe they don't inspire love and joy, but they provide for life's needs and allow people to have hobbies that give them joy or allow them to achieve other goals.

Other jobs and careers are described as “callings” and “a life's work”. These can give people purpose. Though, one person's dream job can be another person's nightmare, and as your life changes, your preferences and needs from a job will also change. How we make our job choices is highly individual and case-specific. This includes the decision to not have a job as well. Commonly for expat parents, the decision

to leave the job market is another big step in a career journey.

The advice of “Live to Work, or Work to Live” takes a practical approach to jobs and life. It invites people to think about what they really want and need in life, and how a job can give them that.

It's a good time to talk about Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, a chart created by psychologist Abraham Maslow to describe what humans need. At the bottom of the pyramid, forming the most essential needs are Physiological Needs like food and shelter, then the next tier is Safety and Security, followed by Love and Belonging, Self-Esteem, and finally Self-Actualization at the peak, meaning achieving one's full potential. It's not all-encompassing, but it is a good framework for thinking about what you need and how to go about achieving it.


The nature of work is constantly changing. Now there is the emergence of flexible work hours with a

4-day work week called 4/10, where the traditional 40-hour work week is condensed. There are even calls for a 32-hour work week with an extra day off, which has been argued to increase productivity. It was trialed in the UK and was a demand of the recent United Auto Workers strike. Of course during the past few years, the workforce has adapted to working from home and seen the rise in popularity of digital nomads who work remotely from global destinations of their choice. Plus, who knows what ramifications of artificial intelligence and automation will end up changing in the near future. This is all to say, there is ever more flexibility and options to fit your particular needs.

“What You Do In Your Free Time Defines Your Future”

Some people like keeping their hobbies separate from work. Doing them as a job would ruin the experience. Others view hobbies as a great way to explore interests and potential careers. Your free time allows you to

grow and develop as a person. You can pursue interests, grow a family, or learn new skills. You can work toward goals like studying for a higher degree or certification. You can expand a hobby that later becomes a different career or side job.

Speaking of side hustles, a trend among modern workers is to create multiple income streams. Diversification of income generation is seen as

insurance in the face of potential economic downturns like the 2008 Global Financial Crisis and Covid-19. More people are turning toward things like investing, short-term home rentals, and selling things they make. CBS News reported in March 2023 about a study from LendingTree and YMNTS that showed nearly half of American workers have a side hustle.

“ Be Indispensable at Your Job ”

The fraternal twin of the advice “Find something you are good at, that you’re better at than other people.” This basically means you should know what role you fill in the larger picture and do it well. Think about the value exchange between your company and yourself. This is good practice for a job interview or application as well. What unique value do

you bring and why should you be hired or accepted? It’s a very capitalistic approach to work, but that is the modern system. What are the needs and how do you solve them? This thinking can be applied to entrepreneurs as well. Find a need and solve it or create a demand and supply it.

The popular self-help book “Outliers” by Malcolm Gladwell, popularized the concept of requiring 10,000 hours of practice to achieve mastery of something. Whether the strategy is fail-proof or not, becoming an expert at something is a sure way to gain job security and command higher compensation for your work.

“ Love What You Do and You’ll Never Work a Day in Your Life ”

Everyone has heard this advice. To many people, this is the ultimate

goal. The best scenario is that you find a job you are passionate about and love doing it. This advice may seem like you have your head in the clouds, but it does bring up good logic. If you like what you do and “follow your passion,” you’ll want to spend time doing it, and likely do it well. You’ll likely reach that 10,000 hours of expertise if you get joy from doing what you practice.

This level of enlightenment is dependent on knowing yourself, knowing what you enjoy and what you are good at, as well as what you don’t like and what you aren’t good at. Much of primary and secondary school nowadays emphasizes exploring and developing passions through classes and extra-curriculars.

In school, you probably were given a career test that asked you a series of questions to determine your interests, then spat out a suggested career. These tests do not have a reputation for being particularly useful or accurate, but they get kids thinking about careers, and the philosophy of aligning interests and abilities is a good basic formula.

Academics have continued to fine-tune and produce new personality assessments. These psychological profilers are having a bit of a heyday in popular culture. There is the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, which categorizes people into 12 personalities according to factors like extroversion and introversion, how they think and feel, and reactions to external information. There are also specific business-oriented talent assessments like the CliftonStrengths by Gallup which argues for building on an individual’s strengths because when you’re good at something, you’ll likely enjoy doing it due to the positive feedback loop of success.

These tests should be taken with a

grain of salt lest we enter into a dystopian fiction without choice, but they can help you think about how you are different compared to others and your unique offerings.

Lastly, you can ask a friend. Seeing yourself clearly is difficult. Asking someone close to you especially someone in the workplace for feedback can be harsh or embarrassing but if you can stomach it, ultimately useful.


“Be a Self-Learner”


School teaches you knowledge and the focus is on getting into college. But after you’ve done internships and finally get your first job, advice and support are less readily available. You need to take on that responsibility, be a self-learner, and develop a “growth mindset.”

Many career coaches advocate for conducting career checkups once or twice a year. In a Forbes article, career coach Nancy Collamer advocates seven steps.

1. Reflect on the year. Ask if you are satisfied with the job while noting down what you’d like to change. Remember that not every job is enjoyable all the time. It is better to take a longer view to assess. Compile a highlight reel of accomplishments to see your strengths and abilities.
2. Update your resume and professional profiles like LinkedIn.
3. Identify opportunities for professional development.
4. Audit your digital footprint by Googling yourself to see what potential employers would see.
5. Schedule time for networking.
6. Make health goals and changes.
7. Research new job possibilities.

It is important to stay up to date with advancements in your industry by learning the latest technology. If





your employer doesn't offer regular job training, take it upon yourself to upskill and earn the skills needed for a promotion. Many online tutorials exist along with traditional education like books and advanced degree programs.

Also important is building a professional network such as finding career coaches or mentors. Join a professional organization or a school alumni network. When you are searching for a new job, talk to people who have worked in the company you are interested in. Hearing personal experiences is very informative research.

“ Dress for the Job You Want ”

It may be superficial, but humans are social beings. There are codes and customs for appropriate work attire across industries and countries. Dressing appropriately and looking the part indicates understanding, respect, and fitting into the culture. Some employers will even earmark a clothing allowance for employees.

A company or brand may have a certain image and reputation they

desire to project. It is the same reason why banks are built with sturdy Greek columns. Being able to identify and emulate a company's culture is a valuable soft skill.

The tangible hard skills of a job are learned and practiced, and so too can the interpersonal soft skills. More value is being placed on emotional intelligence (EQ), communication, leadership, adaptability, and time management to name a few.

“ Define Your Own Meaning of Success ”

There isn't one set career path, or life path, or correct path. A job is just one part of life, a necessary and important part, but just one aspect of the journey of life. You find success through achieving your own goals. A career sometimes can't be planned, it's the collection of twists and turns you take along the way. **SF**



It has been two decades since the founders' vision first took root. Since then, thousands of students have entered Dulwich College Shanghai Pudong and graduated 'Worldwise', ready to take on the future.

Heritage of Educational Excellence

From the first Dulwich College in London, to the seven global campuses today, Dulwich College Shang-

hai Pudong draws from the Dulwich DNA of educational excellence that started over 400 years ago. With high standards of teaching, high expectations of learners, and high quality of facilities, Dulwich knows how to achieve excellence and continues forward in pursuit of more.

Dulwich College Shanghai Pudong consistently wins top awards and recognition, such as from “The

World's Best School Prizes” by T4 Education, where the school was recognized for Supporting Healthy Lives, and “The International School Awards” by ISC Research, which saw the school shortlisted in top 3 for Ethical Values Education.

Last year the Class of 2023 students achieved outstanding scores on the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme exams, scoring an average of 37.8 out of 45 points, significantly above the global average of 30.24. Additionally, 38.6% of students scored above 40 points, while one earned full marks with 45 points, 29.8% of students completed bilingual diplomas, and all achieved a



100% pass rate. This continues the strong tradition with past average IB scores of 39.8 (2022), 39.2 (2021), and 37.8 (2020).

IGCSE scores in 2023 followed suit with 79% of grades awarded A or A* and 42% of students earning exclusively A or A* results.

The legacy of school alumni continues to inspire and create pioneering paths for younger students to follow toward dream universities, careers, and achievements.

Highlights from History

Over the past 20 years, many memorable events have taken place at Dulwich College Shanghai Pudong.

2003, the story began as the younger DUCKS campus opened with 26 students and 48 staff.

2004, a year later the Senior School opening its doors for the first time to students.

2006, the rock legends Rolling Stones made landing in Shanghai and invited Dulwich Choir students and staff on stage to perform with them.

2008, students perform in concert with the visiting New York Philharmonic Orchestra.

2012, Dulwich Pudong orchestra performs in Vienna.

A look back at our early days. *By Lynn Yen*

"We called it Shanghai Family, but really, it was designed to support the trailing spouse, usually the mother. They often had the most difficult experience. Children went to school, husbands had very busy jobs, that left mothers running everything else in an incredibly foreign situation with little Mandarin ability. Many women had given up jobs and left supportive family members behind. So, we really saw it as a service." - Kate Lilienthal



Kate from back in the day

It all started when the first Executive Editor of Shanghai Family, Kate Lilienthal, saw a need among the expat community. Now based in Singapore, Kate reflects on the early days.

"I was sitting in a ball pit in the play area of a condo complex on Fuxing Lu. I was talking with other moms about where to find healthcare. Eugenia Yen was one of them. No one really seemed to know. Everything was just so very foreign. I thought, why not start a newsletter with relevant information for expat moms, similar to the Bay Area Parent I wrote for in San Francisco? I asked Eugenia if she'd like to do it with me and she said, "Why not?"

We called it Shanghai Family, but really, it was designed to support the trailing spouse, usually the mother. They often had the most difficult

experience. Children went to school, husbands had very busy jobs, that left mothers running everything else in an incredibly foreign situation with little Mandarin ability. Many women had given up jobs and left supportive family members behind. So, we really saw it as a service. We had no goals. I came to China thinking I would collect a funny amalgam of expat stories and turn it into a memoir. Instead, we started a magazine.

We launched in September 2005. I remember this distinctly because I went around delivering our first issue when I was very pregnant with my son, Owen, who was born the next month. My beloved ayi, who is still beloved to us all these years later, distributed the magazines to expat locations on her moped. She was completely baffled by what her 8-month pregnant tai-tai was doing.

At first, it was just my friend Eugenia. She connected us to Community Center Shanghai and their director at the time, Nate Showalter, brought on a third early founder Andrea Phillips. It was a group project from the start. My neighbor and good friend Irma Smit did a lot of our photography. My other neighbor and good friend, Anja Fehrensen helped with photo shoot setups. Another friend, Jingbo Wu, helped with advertising sales. Friends and people from the expat community wrote content and gave ideas.

I remember we shot a Christmas issue in the courtyard of my apartment complex in Old Xuhui in September in about 30-degree heat, in winter hats and parkas with a roaring fire pit. My neighbors from those days and I still laugh about it, all in different countries now," Kate said.

Many readers felt an instant connection to the magazine. It filled a need for guidance and connection in a foreign culture, like it did for Marianne Yo who did advertising sales for Shanghai Family.

"I first came to Shanghai in 1999 with a newborn and it was a steep learning curve for me, as a new mother in a foreign land, where although I am ethnically Chinese, there were huge cultural differences. My life pretty much revolved around the family. After leaving and returning to Shanghai, because my twins were so young there were often pangs of guilt when I left them at home with the helpers. In a sense, I did feel trapped with the limited social life I had outside of home. I chanced upon the magazine at the school reception area. I was so drawn to the publication, and it was such a lifesaver for me. I wanted to contribute and be involved," Marianne said.

Over the years, Shanghai Family has grown and evolved. September 2005 was the first newsletter, 2006 saw the first magazine and a partnership with Community Center Shanghai, in 2007 the website launched, 2009 came the sale to Ringier, and 2018 brought the move to Xinmin News.

According to Kate, "A critical success factor was getting distribution through the schools. This was thanks to the Community Center Shanghai. They had the school relationships and made the introductions. Schools agreed to distribute because they also saw what we were doing as a service intended to offer expats support. Without the schools, we would have muddled along for a time and probably petered out.

When my husband took a job in Singapore, the kids and I stayed in Shanghai for another year while I worked on transitioning the magazine to Ringier. I loved every minute of working on it and it was really hard to leave.

I'm proud of what we built, which was a publication good enough, and relevant enough, to continue today. I

think we had the serendipity to start something that struck a chord. Really, so much in China at the time was open territory. If you had an idea, you could run with it."

Shanghai Family has brought global nomads together in a foreign land. It's been a resource for expats to share their stories, experiences and struggles while finding others that understand what they are going through. So let's celebrate how far we've come, and look forward to what the future has in store! **SF**

what they want, but to choose subjects and activities that they are passionate about, and to follow them with great intensity. Some students won't make a final career decision until university after exposure to possibilities through research, university-industry relationships, and internships.

In Year 10, the focus is building a strong foundation for character, soft skills, and academic development through a curriculum based on 'The Seven Habits of Highly Effective Teens', by Sean Covey. They begin to see the importance of qualities, values, skills, and how they relate with others, which leads to future success in life and university applications. The school also introduces a career exploration project.

In Year 11, the focus shifts to career readiness by exploring the different facets of working life, transferrable skills, and jobs. For example, students develop presentation skills, interview skills, and build a resumé.

Career and University Guidance at YCIS Shanghai

Empowering students with the tools and skills for after graduation and finding the best university fit.

For high school seniors, the autumn semester means finalizing college applications, a culmination of their academic careers so far. This process can be stressful, but programmes like the Career and University Guidance Office (CUGO) at Yew Chung International School of Shanghai, exist to aid students in preparing for life after graduation. The CUGO programme is led by Roger Underhill, who has over six years experience helping students to identify and achieve their future goals.

CUGO at YCIS

Students at YCIS Shanghai go through a four-year curriculum to prepare them for life after graduation

starting with project-based learning and followed by detailed application and transition support in Year 13.

"Every student is different and develops at a different rate in academics, co-curricular activities, and career interests. But the reality is that in Y9, Y11 and Y13, students must make academic choices," Underhill said.

YCIS's CUGO programme gives students the tools of using a top-down or bottom-up approach toward future planning and decision-making. Top-down is to know the future life and career they want, and to choose courses and develop skills that are needed to gain entry to that career. Bottom-up is to not know

In Year 12, the focus is on university and course research with information on the different educational strengths in each geographical region, university types, and education philosophies. Here the concept of 'best fit' is prioritized, where students choose the region, location, and university type that is most likely to see them thriving and achieving their highest potential. The CUGO programme further reviews all aspects of the admissions process from transcripts and recommendations to standardized testing and essay writing for each region. An additional possibility is the YCIS work experience programme. It is an area of expansion this year, with more companies connecting with YCIS.

Applying to College Today

With college admissions constantly evolving, it can seem like the rules of the game are being rewritten every year. But Underhill argues at its core, it's still the same.

"To wonder what the most valued components are, is perhaps, to miss the point. We see that individual US universities do not attach the same importance to each aspect of the application. So 'most valued' is relative!" Underhill said.

Instead, Underhill points to what is valued consistently across all universities in all regions, which is the assessment of the student's ability to thrive and graduate with good grades. The factors that contribute to this are a demonstrated academic track record to cope with the academic demands of university, an ability to overcome difficulties when problems surely arise, and a willingness to engage with the university community and the larger community.

To get in-depth and tailored guidance about universities and regions, students and parents should engage with their high school counsellors, like in YCIS Shanghai's CUGO programme.

"We exist because the admission landscape cannot be reduced to a few factors for each region. It's not like that," Underhill said.

YCIS University Outcomes

The focus at YCIS is on supporting students to find their best fit university, where they can follow their passions and thrive. Each student is different, and a great fit will support academic and non-academic success.

In 2023, YCIS students applied to seven geographical regions, with matriculations to world-class universities like Canada's University of Toronto; China's Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University and Nottingham, Ningbo, City University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, and The University of Hong Kong; Singapore's Nanyang Technological University and the National University of Singapore, The Netherlands' University of Amsterdam and University of Groningen; the UK's University of Edinburgh, University of Manchester, University of Southampton, and University of the Arts London; the US's Boston University, Brandeis University, DePaul University, New York University, Pennsylvania State University, Rutgers University-New Brunswick, University of California, Davis, and Wayne State University. I am French from Lyon and have worked 16 years at Lycée Français de Shanghai. I've earned a master's degree in physical education, specializing in social, physical and mental handicaps. In France, I was a national badminton level player, a coach in several clubs and head of a national badminton club. Besides my PE classes, I also supervise the badminton activity from grades 1 to 12 in Qingpu campus.

How many sports does your school provide?

Our school is federated to the French national education system. PE activities are listed by the national education authorities, but we have freedom of choice with a few activities. In France, PE is a real part of the curriculum with post-graduation schools and universities looking at results in physical education.

In our school PE class, we provide broad instruction in swimming, rescue swimming, track and field, football, basketball, handball, volleyball, ultimate frisbee, badminton, table tennis, gymnastics, dance, contemporary dance, art of circus, acrosport, fitness, climbing, boxing, and wrestling.



What is your school's philosophy about sports education?

A sound mind in a sound body. Students learn to take responsibility and play roles of referee, observer, coach, and sparring partner. Health, security, and hygiene are key and basic points in our daily work. They learn safety practices of warmups, safety protocol for each activity, and respecting others and themselves. There is also the chance to learn how to become sports officials in the sports they like. This is something linked to the French National Sport Scholarship, and they get an official certification they can use after high school in France and other countries.

Students can practice sports based on their own desires and needs. Leisure and competition are both welcomed. We simply want them to find their own way to be happy, brave and to become good world citizens!

What new developments have been happening?

This year is special for us as France will host the summer Olympics. Of course, there are some events linked to that.

As a Eurocampus, the French and German schools share facilities. We organize common training, games, and events such as The Eurocampus cross country with other 1,200 students in both Qingpu and Yangpu campuses. We also managed to create a unique Eurocampus basketball last year and hope to continue developing and enriching our friendship. Please introduce yourself.

I am Achille Messi and have worked for 9 years in the school. I'm a certified football coach for kids under 5 to 18. I strive to create a dynamic and inclusive environment where students can explore their athletic abilities, develop their passion for sports, and build lifelong skills that extend beyond the field of play.

How many sports does your school provide?

Our competition section encompasses 11 sports. Individual sports include athletics, badminton, dance, climbing, gymnastics, swimming, table tennis. Team sports are basketball, football, rugby, volleyball.

We participate in over 270 events during the year in several inter-schools leagues such as SISAC, SSSA, Y League (Shanghai International Youth Soccer League), SSL (Shanghai Swimming League), and CISSA. Our students can engage in competitive sports and develop their athletic abilities. These leagues also foster a sense of camaraderie, teamwork, and sportsmanship among students from different schools.

What is your school's philosophy about sports education?

Children's Myopia

Jiahui explains ways to prevent and control.

Myopia, also known as nearsightedness can be inconvenient for children who are naturally active. There is currently no cure for myopia. As the level of myopia increases, the probability of glaucoma, cataract, retinal detachment, and muscular degeneration also increases.

Prevention

1. Start eye checks from age three years old

A comprehensive ophthalmological examination will determine whether the hyperopia reserve and axial eye length growth are in line with the benchmark for that age.

2. Maintain regular checkups

Get an eye check every 6 to 12 months as it can provide insights into various indicators and interventions can be taken in advance.

3. Good habits

Maintaining a good posture and not straining the eyes can maintain the hyperopia reserve and prevent the rapid decline of the eyes.

Control

If a child has already developed myopia, sci-

entific methods can be used to control the rapid development.

● Eye drops

Low-concentration atropine eye drops can effectively control the growth rate of the axial eye length which causes myopia. However, it temporarily paralyzes the eye muscles, causing pupil dilation, and preventing the ability of the eye to adjust which can cause photophobia and blurred vision. If this occurs, it is recommended to wear sunglasses in bright environments, and temporarily wear glasses if necessary.

Based on the doctor's recommendation, glasses or orthokeratology lenses may also be required.

● Glasses

Correction measures can be taken according to the specific refractive error in order to achieve clear vision and avoid causing eye fatigue. Defocus glasses can correct myopia as well as slow down the growth of the eye's axial length, thereby controlling the development of myopia.

● Orthokeratology lenses (OK lenses)

Orthokeratology lenses are rigid contact lens with high oxygen permeability, which can be worn at night when sleeping. Once they are removed after wearing them for 8 to 10 hours while sleeping, vision will be clear throughout the day. This is convenient for children who enjoy sports.

OK lenses can reverse myopia, improve retinal hyperopia, blurred vision, and effectively control the axial length growth of the eye.

The effect of the orthokeratology lenses is not permanent once the lens are removed. It is necessary to wear them every day at the same time to ensure optimal improvement.

● Soft contact lenses

Children can wear defocus incorporated soft contact lenses during the day to correct their vision while controlling their myopia.

The soft contact lenses should be worn for 10-15 hours during the day, for 6 days per week. After removing the lenses, glasses must be used.

The advantage of these lenses is that they are replaced with new lenses every day, a good choice for parents who are worried about lens hygiene.

The prevention and control of myopia in children is a long process, which requires the cooperation of healthcare providers and families. Regular follow-ups are required to achieve safe and effective control.

All About the Flu Vaccine

Global HealthCare answers frequently asked questions.



It's that time of year again. The flu comes back around and no one wants to be stuck in bed at home sick. Protect your family with Global HealthCare as they answer frequently asked questions about the flu vaccine.

What is the "flu"?

The "flu" (influenza) is an airborne infection that is caused by the influenza virus. It can easily be passed from one person to another by close physical contact, coughing or sneez-

ing. Compared with common cold, flu is caused by a different virus and presents with more severe symptoms, and may cause complications that can in very rare cases cause death.

How soon will symptoms appear if I've been exposed to the flu?

Symptoms can present quickly within the first 1-4 days after exposure.

What are healthy habits to help protect against flu?

Getting an annual flu shot (influenza vaccination) before flu season in September or October is the best way to prevent the infection. Getting vaccinated later, however, can still be beneficial. In addition regular hand washing, covering your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze, and wiping the table and keyboard surfaces can prevent the spread of the flu virus.

It is essential to receive the vaccination in time particularly for those who have a weaker immune system including children and the elderly.

How do you select influenza vaccines?

Influenza is caused by different types of viruses, most commonly influenza A and B. Influenza A viruses are usually named HxNx, and influenza B viruses are mainly of the Victoria and Yamagata strains.

The trivalent influenza vaccine can protect against influenza A viruses (H1N1, H3N2) and B virus (Victoria), while the quadrivalent influenza vaccine can work against another B virus (Yamagata) in addition.

Although the quadrivalent influenza vaccine technically provides the greatest protection, the most crucial factor for protection is timing of the vaccination.

Who should get a flu shot?

Everyone is encouraged to get a flu shot to protect against influenza, unless they have had a severe allergy to eggs or have had a severe reaction to the flu shot in the past.

Is an early influenza vaccination needed?

In view of the fact that antibodies are produced 2-4 weeks after the influenza vaccination and antibody titer begins to decrease after 6-8 months, the best time to vaccinate against influenza in the past has been September to October.

How effective is the flu shot?

When there is a good match between the vaccine and the current year's influenza disease viruses, the influenza vaccine has been shown to prevent illness in approximately 70-90% of vaccinated people.





Meet Cindy Reid

**The founder and CEO of
Cindy Reid Global Golf.**

As one of the top 50 female coaches in the USA, Cindy Reid uses her knowledge and over 30 years of experience in golf to coach champions in Shanghai and abroad who compete on the world's stage. From teaching to coaching, she shares her journey of hard work, turning pro, and love for coaching.

How did you become a professional golfer?

I picked up golf at the age of 24 and never looked back. At the time, I was teaching elementary school and worked as a beverage cart girl at a golf club on weekends. That's when I first took an interest in the game.

Before getting into golf, I played all kinds of sports. I grew up as the ninth of eleven children in a household where you had to compete to survive. My father was a former amateur boxer and my mother was an amateur figure skater, so athletic competition was always part of my life. The competitiveness paid off with a college scholarship and a chance to compete on the USA Junior National Ski Team. At Arizona State I played basketball and softball while studying early childhood education.



For the first two years before deciding to turn pro, I practiced on the driving range, putting green, and short game area. My financial situation meant I couldn't play a full round. When I finally did play, I shot an 82 from the men's tees at the Tournament Players Club of Scottsdale. My coach paid for my green fees and gave me my first set of golf clubs. But more than anything he gave me confidence in myself as a golfer and as a person.

What advice do you have for kids dreaming of being a professional athlete?

Start early - the sooner you start playing, the more time you have to develop your skills and improve your chances of making it to the pros.

Practice, practice, practice - there's no substitute for hard work and dedication. If you want to be a professional athlete, you need to be willing to put in the time and effort to practice your sport every day.

Be coachable - listen to your coaches and trainers and be willing to learn new things. They can help you improve your skills and reach your full potential.

Stay positive - there will be setbacks along the way, but it's important to stay positive and focused on your goals. Don't give up on your dream.

Have fun - Playing sports should be enjoyable. If you're not having fun, it will be difficult to stay motivated. Find a sport that you love playing.

Be realistic - the chances of making it to the pros are very slim. However, if you have the talent, the drive, and the willingness to work hard, you can achieve your dream.

What lessons has being a sportswoman taught you?

One of the most important lessons is that of teamwork. In order to be successful in sports, you need to be able to work together with your teammates and coaches. You need to be able to trust and rely on each other, and you need to be willing to put the team's success ahead of your own.

Another lesson is perseverance. In sports, there will always be setbacks and challenges. You will lose games, make mistakes, and get injured. But if you give up, you will never achieve your goals. You need to be able to persevere through the tough times and keep working hard.

Finally, is the importance of confidence. You need to believe in yourself. You need to have the confidence to take risks and to go for your goals. These are lessons for success in anything you do in life, not just sports.

How did you transition from playing to coaching?

Traveling every week, living out of a suitcase and hotels with no social life outside the ropes was more than I bargained for. I loved playing the game, but I disliked tour life. After 10 years and four wins professionally, I decided to go in another direction. More than anything, I love teaching the game to others. I wake up every morning wanting to get to the lesson tee to help my next student.

In 2010, I was invited by a good friend to bring my golf instructional business to Mission Hills in Shenzhen, China, which happen to be the world's largest golf facility with 12 golf courses. Little did I know that it was his family's business. I was very excited to share my knowledge of the game with a new audience, and I quickly fell in love with the country.



What is your approach to mentoring students?

My approach is to provide the resources and support they need to succeed. Every student has potential and I am committed to helping them reach their full potential.

I get to know each student's natural swing, strengths, weaknesses, and tailor to their needs. I create a supportive environment where students feel comfortable taking risks and asking questions. I am always available to students and parents to provide help and feedback. We've even launched an app for parents to enhance communication, view instructional videos, and have transparency in their child's progress. [SF](#)

Spanish Carabineros Shrimp Risotto

Enjoy an authentic Mediterranean flavor at Asador Mediterranean Restaurant & Bar of Conrad Shanghai.

Risotto is a traditional Italian rice dish, originating in rice-rich northern Italy, and is a very characteristic dish in the Milan area. Following the risotto cooking method, brings a rich sense of hierarchy infused with Spanish ingredients, vegetables and seafood stock; Spanish carabineros shrimp provides rich and fragrant shrimp brain, shrimp oil, and shrimp meat which are perfectly infused with rice, making this Mediterranean dish flavorful and delicious!

Ingredients

150g Carabinero shrimp
50g Chickpea
60g Artichoke
100g White onion, finely chopped
50g Garlic, finely chopped
8g Thyme
1g Bay leaf
0.2g Saffron
220g Spanish rice
1 liter Seafood stock
150ml White wine
100ml Olive oil
20g Lemon wedge
30g Arugula
100g Black garlic mayonnaise
Salt & white pepper for seasoning

Instructions

1. Drizzle the olive oil over a paella pan set at medium-high temperature, then stir-fry onion and garlic to soften, then stir in the Spanish rice for 2 minutes. Add the seafood stock and allow it to simmer with artichoke, chickpea, thyme, bay leaf, and saffron for an optimal duration of 5 minutes.
2. Cook the carabinero shrimp separately with a dash of salt, white pepper, and white wine to complement the oceanic flavors, let this medley dance within a pan for approximately 5 minutes.



3. As a final touch, adorn the paella with perfectly cooked carabinero shrimp, then place the paella pan in a preheated oven maintained at 180 degrees Celsius for 12 minutes. Before serving, generously add the lemon wedge, arugula, black garlic mayonnaise on top to complete this culinary masterpiece.



Career Qs

What preparation and training does it take to become a professional chef?

First of all, you need to have passion and love of food and cooking. Secondly, a professional school to receive systematic and effective training to familiarize yourself with the theoretical knowledge. Lastly, you need to practice in different sub-divisions of kitchens to accumulate relevant working experience.

How did you get started in the culinary field?

It stems from my own hobby, and my childhood experience. Since I was a child, my

What is your favorite and least favorite parts of the job?

I really cherish and enjoy the majority of moments during the work, and I am willing

to challenge myself to study more and create new cuisines to bring guests wonderful cuisine concepts as well as tastes. And I like the atmosphere when I am working with young people who are full of passions, energies and motivations.

What advice do you have for young aspiring chefs?

Challenge yourself constantly to enrich your experience, learn to calm down to think independently, and practice to have the ability of withstanding strong pressure. Self-emotional management is also very important. Keep learning to be prepared for career development opportunities. **SF**

New Star Spa

One of my ways to relax is going to a Korean spa. Fortunately, there are plenty in Shanghai. If you have heard of *jjimjilbang*, you should not skip this experience. Different types of saunas, from below zero to 57 degrees Celsius, help reduce day-to-day stress. My best healing tip is the full-body scrub to help my skin stay smooth and shiny. For this massage, you must undress fully and lay on the bed to prepare for the treatments. The

scrubbing in a K-spa will be beyond your expectation. Scrubbing mitts work up and down on your body like grinding cheese on pasta. I know it sounds peculiar for foreigners. When I suggested it to friends, no one gave positive feedback. But after a hot bath, *sikhye*, a sweet-flavored traditional Korean beverage, will cool your stress down.

Korean BBQ: Chenghakgol (青鹤谷)

Experience sizzling BBQ at your table and wrapping it in lettuce with *ssamjang*. Korean BBQ is considered one of the most well-loved dishes. Don't be surprised; it's served with a wide variety of side dishes, including acorn jelly, steamed pumpkin with honey sauce, stir-fried fish cake, and marinated potatoes. It is a typical Korean meal. They all come with the main dish, which would differ depending on the day. For my family, whether we choose pork or beef, I prefer the marinated sauce. Lots of Korean BBQ restaurants are in Puxi, but I strongly recommend Chenghakgol (青鹤谷) in Pudong, which will satisfy your expectations.

The Korean Provisional Government (大韓民國臨時政府舊址)

The Korean Provisional Government (KPG) was a partially recognized Korean government-in-exile based in China during Japanese colonial rule in Korea. This place is a must-go place for Koreans visiting Shanghai. It looks like a humble outfit, but you can feel the independent spirit in every step. This building is located in the vibrant core of the city, Xintiandi. However, visitors experience very solemnly how the Koreans in that period fought for the country's independence.

Belloco

Soju is the famous liquor that comes in the iconic green bottle. But, I want to recommend more styles of Korean liquors to pair with the perfect Korean dish. There are a few Belloco restaurants, but I chose the one in Qiantan neighborhood, near my husband's office. My favorite pairing is sweet, chili chicken with peanut sauce and *yuja soju*. Its memory makes my mouth water. The *yuja soju* is fruity, tangy, and perfect for starting a dish. It goes well with a spicy dish, like seafood *tteokbokki* (stir-fried rice cake) or spicy stir-fried octopus and pork belly (*gochujang jjuggumi jeyook*). I do not have a high tolerance for spice, but I can enjoy this grade. One more recommendation is *makgeolli*, a traditional rice wine. If you sip it for the first time, you wonder if there is any alcohol due to the creamy and smooth flavor. But don't let your guard down. Hiding behind sweetness, it gets you drunk quickly. *Makgeolli* is a good combined with greasy food like *kimchi* pancake or *japchae*.

If I have to choose only one place to introduce Korean culture in Shanghai, Korea Town is at the top of my list. Whatever you expect about Korean culture, you can enjoy everything in K-town. Here is the ultimate go-to list in K-town, but I will give you tips on how to find hidden gems in this hot place. Taste the countryside at Ajimaegukbab (阿姨汤饭面馆), such as *soondae* (Korean-style sausage) stew, steamed pork with spicy octopus, and noodles. Also, you can enjoy one of the most famous foods, *bulgogi*, at Qingjindong (清进洞) on the second floor. After the meal, don't forget the icy dessert on the second floor at Widcoffee. My family never misses the *patbingsu*, shaved ice with toppings of red bean, Oreo, or mango. It's my guilty pleasure! If your gourmet tour is complete, choose how to enjoy your free time—reading books at the Korean library on the 9th floor of Jintong Mansion (进停大厦) or having a blast in a tiny coin karaoke.

Half a World Apart

Family life at a distance. *By Rachel Wright*



“ Hello? Hello?”

I can't see my husband's face. The screen is black.

“I'm in the car, on my way to a business dinner.”

This is how we've been communicating the past few months, since my daughter and I left Shanghai to come live in the UK.

It's all very well eulogizing the advances of technology but WeChat sucks. It can't give me his well-muscled body to admire, his famously warm hands, and his shoulder to cry on.

Friends had warned me it wasn't a good idea to break up the family. But like others on the fence - should we stay or should we go? - Covid had tipped the balance. My husband objected, and was

over-ruled. My daughter got her way. I would take her to the UK to finish her last two years and prep for uni there. Gone was the *aji*, Didi and our stress-free living in the bubble of Minhang for the last decade. Hello: assembling a standing work-desk, drilling holes to install a video doorbell and bleeding a radiator. (Of course I got help. Too late to be self-sufficient at my age.)

Now, my daughter calls her dad on her 15-minute walk to school in the mornings. Sometimes he can pick up and they chat. Despite worries over making friends and constantly ridiculing the rules of her new, girls-only fancy private school, she's probably the one who's adapted best to our new set-up. And her cat (of course, she insisted on bringing the ginger tom we adopted). No longer concerned about him ingesting poisoned meat or being terrorised by raccoon dogs, I watch him roam the garden



while I eat a sandwich for lunch.

“Having dinner” comes back in the chat.

My husband is traveling more since we left. He's probably working even harder, now he has no-one to nag him about spending time with family and multitasking on his phone over breakfast. I'll remind him at Christmas.

It feels like I'm in limbo - gradually assembling a life of sorts, but grateful for the support of friends in Shanghai and those who left already that can help me believe it will get better. When my daughter went through her leaving crisis, I told her “don't think that you're leaving Shanghai behind; think, instead, that you're adding another dimension to your life.” I promised her we'll go back this summer. 



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
